# Join the Party

## Edinburgh plans two-day blowout for bicentennial

**F**rom the skies above Edinburgh, local residents will have the chance to gain a unique perspective on its 200-year history.

They'll be able to lift off in a hot air balloon, rising above the two-day festival and celebration that is the Bicentennial Bash. People can watch lumberjack all-stars chop, hack, saw and climb, all in recognition of Edinburgh's lumber and veneer history. Pony rides, magic shows, petting zoos and all kinds of local vendors will keep kids and adults entertained.

And from Friday to its close late Saturday night, live music will keep the crowds grooving.

A bicentennial is a once-in-a-lifetime celebration, and organizers of Edinburgh's 200th birthday are making sure it's an event no one will forget. From food to historical displays to performances to fireworks, people will have an opportunity to discover everything that the town has been and the community it continues to foster.

“This whole year has been about researching and digging into our history to find interesting stories and anecdotes we can share with the community,” Sarabeth Drybread, director of the community center, said. “People are very excited. We have people from out of state coming back for the celebration, who are really looking forward to this historic event we're having.”

“We're looking at this like a big family reunion for our town, where people can talk and reminisce and have a meal together and listen to music.”

## Norman Carr

Norman Ross Carr, 102, of the Otterbein Franklin SeniorLife Community in Franklin, passed away Tuesday, May 24, 2022.

He was born Nov. 17, 1919, in Indianapolis, to Rugg Ross Carr and Opal (Breedlove) Carr. He married Mary Kathryn "Kay" (Joyner) Carr on July 31, 1943 in Indianapolis. She preceded him in death on May 22, 2011.

He was a United States Army veteran of WWII, having been inducted on Dec. 31, 1941 at Ft. Benjamin Harrison in Indianapolis. Norman was honorably discharged on Sept. 16, 1943 due to combat wounds at the Battle of Buna, New Guinea, having received two Purple Hearts, a Bronze Star and the Presidential Citation. Upon his discharge, Norman began working at RCA, then Coca-Cola before moving to Boone County to farm. Later he moved to Shelby County to begin farming with an uncle and continued to expand until his retirement in 1982. He supplemented his living by working part-time at L.S. Ayers and Company during the 1970s. Upon retirement, he and his wife spent their winters in Fort Myers, Florida during the 1980s until the mid-1990s.

Norman served on the school board of Southwestern Consolidated School Corp. in Shelby County from 1966 until 1969. He also served on the Shelby County Fair Board during the 1960s. After retirement, he took up golf, card playing, traveling and eating out. He was a member of the Jollity United Methodist Church in Shelby County and attended Grace United Methodist Church in Franklin most recently.

Survivors include his two daughters Barbara L. "Bobbi" Johnson of Fishers and Sharalee J. "Sharry" Kabrich of Edinburgh; three grandsons, Troy D. Kabrich (Jody Gray) of Clayton, N.C., Thomas "Scott" Kabrich (Kimberly Cleveland) of Wolcottville, Ind., Todd R. Kabrich (Jill Pliske Kabrich) of Tomball, Texas; one granddaughter, Teri L. Kabrich of Decatur, Ind.; six great grandchildren and several nieces and nephews. Norman, as an only child, considered his mother's nephews as close as brothers and those surviving are Billy Jo Tolson of Redondo Beach, Ca., and Mrs. Tom (Betty Fox) Nelson, Shelbyville.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Rugg Ross Carr and Opal (Breedlove) Carr; his wife Mary Kathryn "Kay" (Joyner) Carr; an infant daughter at birth Janet Kay Carr; son-in-laws Terry Johnson and Thomas Kabrich; and his mother's nephews, Robert Pauls, Richard Pauls, Tom Nelson and Jack Nelson, all formerly

# Lancers receive honors at conference banquet

Eight Lancers were honored at the annual MHC Spring Sports Banquet last Thursday. After getting a win and then being eliminated in the sectional, the varsity baseball team saw their season come to an end, and the varsity golf team turned in a couple of very good rounds in advance of the IHSAA tournament.

May 26 had the golfing Lancers playing at Shelbyville's Blue Bear Golf Course. They finished third in the three-way match with host Shelbyville and Morristown with just 11 strokes separating the three schools.

Edinburgh's Max Blandford was the medalist for the day with a 37. Mason Calhoun checked in with a 46, Trevor Moon 48, Cash Cunningham 53, Devyn Milburn 56 and Keegan Smith 64.

After a couple of rain delays, the varsity baseball team finally saw sectional action at Morristown on Memorial Day.

Playing in the semi-finals that morning, they were able to defeat Waldron 7-6 to advance to the evening's championship game.

The good guys fell behind early but exploded for seven big runs in the fourth inning and were never headed despite giving up runs to the Mohawks in the fifth and sixth frames.

Riley Palmeter had a pair of base hits on the morning, Landen Burton and Jarrett Turner each doubled and Travis Jones hit an absolute bomb to left field for a home run. Palmeter and Nick Detling each carded two RBIs while Jones and Gabe Bennett each drove in one run.

Bennett was the game's winning pitcher, allowing three earned runs and four hits in four innings of work while striking out six Waldron batters.

Monday evening's championship game was against Indianapolis Lutheran, which won the other morning game against host Morristown to advance.

The Lancers drew first blood, plating a run in the top half of the first inning. Things then went south for Edinburgh as the Saints answered with four runs in the bottom of the first and then added three more in their half of the second en route to a 12-2, six inning win over Edinburgh.

Travis Jones and Riley Palmeter collected the Lancers' only two hits in the game with Palmeter's being a double. He also had Edinburgh's only RBI in the contest. Jones suffered the loss to the sectional champs in his three innings as the game's starting pitcher.

Golf was back in action on the following day, May 31. They took on both Southwestern and Oldenburg Academy at Timbergate. The Lancers fell by 10 strokes to their nemesis this season, Southwestern. Oldenburg had an incomplete score.

Edinburgh's Max Blandford was once again the medalist in this outing by shooting a 41. Trevor Moon followed with a 51, Cash Cunningham had a 52, Wyatt Burton 53, Mason Calhoun 55, Keegan Smith 57,

Devyn Milburn 58 and Devin Hamilton 62.

The Johnson County Golf Tournament was played last Thursday at The Legends in Franklin. The Lancers finished the tourney in seventh place out of the seven county schools.

Lancer Max Blandford took a DNF as a shoulder problem forced him out of the day's competition. In the 18-hole day, Mason Calhoun shot a 99, Trevor Moon 103, Cash Cunningham 105 and Devyn Milburn 117.

At Thursday's MHC banquet at Hauser, the conference honored its All-Conference athletes in the spring sports.

Lancers recognized were Max Blandford in golf; MacKenzie Bieker, Gracie Crawhorn and Kyah Streeval in softball; Bethany Burton and Peyton Bryant in tennis; and Riley Palmeter in baseball, with Jarrett Turner receiving honorable mention status in baseball.

John Campbell, has designated the entire year a recognition of its 200-year history. Starting with a kick-off dinner in March and continuing with a historic church tour and an exhibit at the Johnson County Museum of History, the anticipation has been building towards this two-day festival, Drybread said.

In the long planning process, organizers wanted to do something completely different than any other Edinburgh festivals.

“We have the Fall Festival with the carnival rides, and our holiday festival with carriage rides. We wanted this to be something unique,” Drybread said. “With this being our 200th anniversary, we wanted to pay homage to our past but also do some things that were kind of pastime activities.”

Entertainment and live music are a big part of that. The planning committee reached out and secured a diverse lineup of music Friday evening and all day Saturday. Celebrate Edinburgh’s Scottish-Irish roots on Friday with a performance by the Ceili Band followed by the rollicking ballads, shanties and folk songs of early America, Ireland and the British Isles.

The swingin’ tunes of Duke Ellington, Django Reinhardt and other up-tempo greats come alive through the music of Dukes of Django. Everything from acous-



tic folk to hip-hop to full-band rock is in the repertoire of Barely Bones.

Headliner Rusty Bladen is one of the most active and well-known acts in the Indiana music scene. His homegrown brand of rock has produced nine albums and more than 5,000 shows throughout his career.

“Having two days of live music is going to be really special,” Drybread said. “Entertainment is always going to be going on.”

Other performances are planned by magician Laif Ryan, as well as the family-centric musical stylings of Mr. Daniel. Kids can relax in the petting zoo and take pony rides, while food trucks, a beer garden and more than 40 vendors will keep the grown-ups in the crowd entertained throughout the weekend.

But arguably the most attention-grabbing feature will be the hot air balloon, which will launch from the grass of School Hill on Saturday evening.

“It’s an old way of transportation, and we thought it would be fun,” Drybread said. “You can see the whole town from up there. We wanted to take the celebration to the skies and look over the entire community while we celebrate this big occasion.”

The lumberjack show is another highlight of the festival. Timber experts from the All American Lumberjack Show will

split into two teams to square off in 10 exciting lumberjack events, from log rolling to axe throwing to hot saw racing.

“We wanted to recognize our rich veneer and lumber industry, and I was trying to think, what could we do with wood?” Drybread said.

For as long as the bicentennial festival has been planned, it seems surreal that it is less than a week away. But anticipation has been building throughout the Edinburgh community, and that’s going to make for an event that will be hard to forget, Drybread said.

“It really is about the memories. We’re going to working really hard to document this event with photo opportunities for families, and we’re going to have a videographer there. We want to capture this event,” she said.
