Greenwood, Franklin businesses offering special incentives, fun for ‘Shop Local’ event

When it comes to holiday gifting, nothing can beat shopping local for unique and one-of-a-kind finds and many local communities are offering incentives and deep discounts as part of their “Shop Local” specials this season.

Shoppers in Old Town Greenwood can anticipate an extended two-day event this year a bit prior to the traditional Small Business Saturday’s “Shop Local” event held Nov. 26.

Julie Allen, co-owner of PC ParaMedix in Greenwood and organizer with Discover Old Town Greenwood, says the holiday shopping season will officially start with the return of Old Town Greenwood’s 2022 Holiday Open House from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. Friday and 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday, November 18 and 19.

“This is our seventh holiday open house,” Allen says. “There are 20 stores participating.”



Shoppers can visit one of the participating downtown proprietors for a punch card that can be redeemed at a minimum of 10 of 16 participating stores for a chance to win some fabulous prizes, Allen says, including gift baskets that include items from all the participating stores.

Friday evening is essentially kids' night as Santa will be on the porch at PC ParaMedix, located at 199 North Madison, from 5 to 8 p.m. for free photos. There will also be a variety of craft-making activities available that evening for the kids, including cupcake decorating at A Piece of Cake, 484 N. Madison Ave., string art at the Teal Canary, 199 N. Madison Ave., and the Sassafrass Tea Room, located at 229 N. Madison Ave., will have cookie decorating.

Saturday, visitors will find Santa at One Self Yoga, located at 205 S. Madison Ave., Suite 202, striking periodic yoga poses between pics and chatting with kiddos who come to say hi.

A pop-up market featuring local artisans will be held in the parking lot of the Village Shoppes located just off Madison Avenue Saturday, as well, Allen says.

"There will be all homemade items by local vendors," Allen says. "And there will be a hot drink stand at the Coffee House at the Pringle's Barber Shop (at 201 N. Madison Ave)."

When you look beyond all the festivities and events, such as this one, they are a prime opportunity to not only have fun and make memories, but also a chance to build community and support local business, Allen says.

Although supporting local business should be a 365 day-a-year intention, the holidays are a great introduction for those who haven't discovered all that shopping small has to offer.

Originating as a campaign created by American Express to bolster awareness for small businesses, "Shop Local" has become a staple of shopping small for the holidays, says Rosie Chambers, director of the Franklin Chamber of Commerce.

"People weren't really focused on supporting our local businesses," Chambers says. "Sure, you had your favorites, but it wasn't a really concerted effort like it has been."

Since its launch nearly a decade ago, "Shop Local" heralds the start of holiday shopping in Franklin, Chambers says, on Saturday, November 26.

Before shops open at 10 a.m. that day, a line will form early outside the Chamber of Commerce for the return of the much-coveted Chamber Cash.

"Starting at 8 a.m. there will be a line forming," Chambers says. "We only offer Chamber Cash for the first 100 people who come in. Everyone will get a tote bag and some increment of Chamber Cash while it lasts."

Offered in increments of \$10, \$20, \$50 and \$100, Chamber



Cash, which can be redeemed at one of the nearly 40 participating local businesses, is handed out at the Chamber of Commerce early on a first come first serve basis, Chambers explains.

"This year we are giving out \$1,500 in chamber cash," Chambers says. "You can take it to your favorite place and redeem it just as you would cash."

Doors may open for shopping at 10 a.m., however, if you are hoping to land some Chamber Cash, you need to arrive early and snag a spot toward the front of the line since, historically, the line is long but the wait isn't and the cash goes quick.

Although it is up to the individual businesses to set their hours of operation, Chambers says most of them will be adjusting their hours for the holiday season opening more often and staying open later.

"A message we are trying to give as a neighborhood champion for shop small is we want everybody to shop small year-round, not just on the Saturday after Thanksgiving," Chambers says. "It is important to shop our local businesses all year long."



Santa will make his rounds from the train station to the yoga studio amidst flashing cameras and plenty of delicious food and drink, with reindeer in tow, as well as holiday crafts, music and movies to get all who gather in the holiday spirit. "He will get off the train and the train will depart," Comstock says. "Santa will stay and take pictures from 4:30 to 7:30 p.m. and those are free, but you will likely have to wait in line."

Comstock cautions the set-up for Santa will look a bit different than in years past this year simply because adjustments have been made to accommodate the larger crowd that regularly shows up to welcome jolly old Saint Nicholas.

Comstock says she and her staff were still waiting to hear back from representatives for Santa's reindeer, but is confident they will be meeting

up with Santa when he arrives at the station.

Last year's event, which attracted a crowd of nearly 3,000 people, had a line for Santa winding down and around the block, she adds, so arrive early.

Drybread says. There will also be ticketed carriage and trolley rides from 6 to 10 p.m. and tickets for those will be available beginning in mid-November, Drybread says.

The Bicentennially Bright parade will begin at 5:30 p.m. when it departs from East Side Elementary School to meander through Edinburgh's downtown.

Santa will set up shop in the John R. Drybread Community Center for pictures from 6 to 8 p.m. Attendees can look forward to this year's set-up as it will feature a unique backdrop, Drybread says.

"We had a donation of a beautiful piece of furniture made by the Edinburgh Cabinet Company in the late 1800s, so it will be nicely decorated with some vintage Christmas décor and different items from the bicentennial," Drybread says. "So, Santa will be in front of that this year."

Drybread says another new element to this year's festivities is a historic church and home tour. Guided tours will stop outside select locations for commentary about the historical significance, architecture

and family history of the property, Drybread explains.

"It will be a one-time, ticketed tour and we will meet at one location and do a trolley tour," Drybread says. "Those who are interested can call the community center for more information."

# Create a quest-friendly home for holiday visitors

Nothing says “festive” like creating a warm and welcoming home for guests and visitors during the upcoming busy holiday season. The influx of people and activity provides you with an excellent opportunity to put your home’s best face forward. Read on for insights on making a guest-friendly space that will impress friends and family this year.

## Rethink your kitchen

The kitchen has become a major social center of the home, and cooking has become a social event and a time to gather in and of itself. To that end, make your kitchen a focal point of this holiday season.

“The kitchen has become the home’s new parlor or living room,” said Angi Home Interior Expert Rachel Zepernick. “Whether you completely redesign it or just move around furniture, think about ways you can make it as guest-friendly as possible.”

- **Island:** adding a permanent kitchen island will cost you about \$4,000, but it can create many new options for entertaining, such as additional seating for people to gather around during food prep. A rolling island will cost less, \$100 to \$2,500, and serve the same purpose.

- **Improved lighting:** don’t overlook how much lighting can create mood and ambiance, as well as serve a more practical use. A central light, such as a chandelier, can make a striking statement, while task lighting in specific areas will help make measuring ingredients a breeze.

- **Add extra storage:** “One big complaint people have about kitchens is storage, so the more you can add that’s both functional and fun, the better your kitchen is for entertaining purposes,” Zepernick said. “Open or pull-out shelves, rolling carts and turntables work wonders for a busy kitchen.”

- **Remodel for a new layout:** Giving your kitchen a fresh new look can help you entertain with ease. Redesigning your kitchen will cost between \$4,300 and \$25,000, depending on the scope.

“The sky is the limit when it comes to rethinking your kitchen, and a pro can help you consider all your options, based on your vision and budget,” Zepernick said.

## Create a guest-friendly home

Here are some tips on how to quickly prep your home for maximum comfort and give your guests a great experience. Even if you’re short on time, fear not; you can accomplish more cleaning than you think in a hurry if you follow a few tips.

- **Give all guest linens a good wash** and freshly make the beds. Bathrooms, in particular, make a big impression on guests. Wipe down each bathroom thoroughly, paying special attention to the sink, fixtures, floor, shower, tub, and toilet.

- **You can relieve some of the pressure** by hiring a professional cleaner. A one-time cleaning costs between \$90 and \$500, depending on home size and can help make your home guest-ready in a hurry. Keep in mind that if you don’t already have a regu-

lar house cleaner, hiring one on short notice during the season could be tricky.

- **Give your house a walkthrough** from a visitor’s perspective, especially guest rooms, bathrooms, and common areas. What might seem out of place? What things do you notice first? Check to ensure supplies are up to date. Get rid of expired medicine, and stock the cabinets with fresh shampoo, conditioner, soap, towels, and a hair dryer. Also, consider keeping extras of common items for guests, such as razors, over-the-counter medications, feminine products, toothpaste and brushes and cotton swabs.

- **Inspect your light bulbs**, both inside and outdoors. You can easily miss a single burned-out bulb in an area you often walk through.

- **Pay particular attention to cleaning surfaces** that get touched a lot, such as light switches, countertops, and doorknobs. A two-step process is best to eliminate germs and viruses. First clean with soap and water, then use an alcohol or bleach solution to disinfect. Your refrigerator and oven tend to get a good workout during the holidays. Scrub your oven thoroughly to give it a good starting point. Clean and disinfect your fridge’s surfaces. Throw away outdated food, so you have room for leftovers.

- **Give your guests space for their stuff.** At least one surface should be empty in guest bathrooms to allow room for guests’ personal toiletries.






 4 cloves garlic, minced  
 1 cup heavy cream  
 1/2 teaspoon ground white pepper, plus additional, to taste, divided  
 Honey-Lemon Glazed Carrots:  
 2/3 cup honey  
 1/4 cup fresh-squeezed lemon juice  
 1/2 teaspoon sumac  
 1/4 teaspoon lemon zest  
 2 pinches kosher salt, plus additional, to taste, divided  
 1 pinch ground black pepper, plus ad-

ditional, to taste, divided  
 Water  
 1 pound baby rainbow carrots  
 1/3 cup olive oil  
 1 tablespoon unsalted butter  
 Sumac-Crusted Filet Mignon:  
 4 Omaha Steaks Private Reserve Filet Mignons (7 ounces each)  
 2 tablespoons kosher salt  
 1 tablespoon sumac  
 2 teaspoons ground black pepper  
 1 teaspoon dried thyme leaves  
 1/3 cup grapeseed oil  
 3 tablespoons unsalted butter, divided  
 To make garlic mashed potatoes: Add potatoes to stockpot. Cover with cold water by about 1 inch and add 1 pinch salt. Turn on high heat and bring to boil for 12-15 minutes, or until fork tender. Drain and place potatoes in a large mixing bowl.  
 In a saucepan over medium heat, melt butter. Add garlic and simmer for 5 minutes. Add heavy cream, 1 teaspoon kosher salt and 1/2 teaspoon white pepper; bring to boil. When mixture boils, reduce to simmer for 3 minutes then remove from heat.

Mash hot potatoes until most lumps are gone. Using a hand mixer on low speed, slowly add butter and cream mixture until desired smoothness and taste.

Season with salt and white pepper, to taste.

To make honey-lemon glazed carrots: In a small bowl, whisk honey, lemon juice, sumac, lemon zest, and 1 pinch salt and 1 pinch pepper.

Preheat oven to 425 F.  
 Fill the stockpot 2/3 full with water. Bring to a boil and add 1 pinch salt. Blanch carrots in boiling water for 5 minutes. Drain and shock with cold water. When cool enough to handle, halve carrots lengthwise.

In a large sauté pan, over medium-high heat, add oil and butter.

Add carrots to pan, flat sides down, and season with salt and pepper, to taste. Sear until browned, about 2 minutes.

Flip carrots and season with salt and pepper, to taste. Add half of the glaze to the pan and glaze generously. Bake for 3 minutes. Add remaining glaze to carrots

and bake for 2 minutes. Remove glazed carrots from the oven.

To make sumac-crusted filet mignon: Thaw filet mignons in refrigerator overnight, pat dry with paper towels then bring to room temperature, about 30 minutes.

In a small bowl, whisk kosher salt, sumac, black pepper and dried thyme. Season steaks on all sides.

In a cast-iron pan over high heat, add grapeseed oil. Place filets in the pan and cook for 4 minutes until browned and seared. Add 1 tablespoon butter to the pan. Flip filets and butter baste for about 20 seconds. Cook filets for 3 minutes for medium-rare.

Remove filets from pan and top each with 1/2 tablespoon butter. Rest steaks 7-8 minutes.

Place garlic mashed potatoes on a plate and top with sumac-crusted filet mignon. Place honey-lemon glazed carrots next to filet mignon and mashed potatoes.

### Chorizo and Oaxaca Tamales

Prep time: 60 minutes

Cook time: 60 minutes

Servings: 10-12

40 dried corn husks

Water

3 packages Cacique Pork, Beef or Soy Chorizo

1 medium onion (about 1 cup), minced

8 pounds basic tamale dough, at room temperature

3 packages (10 ounces each) Cacique Oaxaca Cheese, cut into 1/2-inch strips

Tamale steamer

Cacique Crema Mexicana, for serving

Cacique Homestyle Mild Salsa, for serving

In large bowl, cover corn husks with boiling water and soak at least 1 hour. Remove excess water and pat each husk dry.

In large skillet, cook chorizo according to package instructions. Add onions; saute over medium heat until translucent, about 5 minutes. Cool thoroughly.

To make tamales: Prepare one husk at a time by placing husk on open palm, smearing 3 tablespoons tamale dough on husk from side to side and to bottom, leaving 3 inches of top untouched for folding. Place 1 tablespoon chorizo mixture in center and top with one strip of Oaxaca. Fold 1/3 of husk to left and 1/3 to right, overlapping; pinch bottom to seal and gently fold over top to create small rectangle.

Add adequate room temperature water to tamale steamer and set steamer grate. Place formed tamales, vertically and upside down, tightly packed. Once first layer of tightly packed tamales is complete, begin second layer of tamales horizontally.

Cover and steam over medium-high heat 45 minutes-1 hour. Check water level at 45 minutes. If water is low, gently add hot water to side of pot.

Remove one tamale to check doneness. Tamale is cooked when dough separates from husk when unwrapping. Serve hot with crema and salsa.

### Oaxaca, Potato and Chorizo Empanadas

Prep time: 20 minutes

Cook time: 30 minutes

Yield: 24 empanadas

Dough:

1 stick, plus 6 tablespoons, cold unsalted butter, cubed



4 cups all-purpose flour

1/2 teaspoon salt

1/2 cup warm water

1 egg, at room temperature, whisked

Filling:

1 package Cacique Pork Chorizo

2 russet potatoes, cubed

5 ounces Cacique Oaxaca Cheese, cubed

1 egg, well-beaten, for egg wash

Preheat oven to 350 F.

To make dough: Use pastry cutter or fork to cut butter into flour until it forms crumbly consistency. Sprinkle in salt and stir. Pour in warm water and egg; stir until clumpy dough forms. Knead dough about 5 minutes. Cut dough into 24 pieces and, using hands, roll each piece

into ball. With rolling pin, roll balls evenly into 5-6-inch circles.

To make filling: In pan over medium heat, cook chorizo, stirring until it crumbles. Add cubed potatoes. Cover and cook until potatoes are soft then uncover and cook 5-10 minutes until liquid evaporates.

Fill empanadas by placing 2-3 tablespoons chorizo and potato mixture with 2-3 Oaxaca cubes in each dough circle. With finger, run egg wash across one side of circles. Fold over and seal edges by pressing down with fork or create folds and pinch to seal filling inside. Brush tops with egg wash.

Prepare parchment-lined baking sheets and place empanadas on sheets. Bake 12-15 minutes until golden-brown.
