# Several Lancer basketball teams see successful week of play

It was a pretty successful week in Lancer basketball as the varsity and JV boys each won a pair as did the seventh grade boys. To go along with that, the eighth-grade girls and both the fifth- and sixth-grade boys all earned a victory in the period.

Jan. 23 had the middle school boys playing in the opening round of the MHC tourney at South Decatur. The evening's lid-lifter saw the seventh-grade Lancers defeat South Decatur's Cougars, 40-29, to advance to the semi-final round of the tourney on Saturday. Carson Siegelin was on fire as he led his team with 23 points, Brinnyn Moss scored eight, Noah Parkhurst four, Xander Pruitt two, Max Dodson two and Brody Cox one. This win boosted the team to 6-8 on the year.

The second game of the night wasn't as friendly to the eighth-grade Lancers as the Cougars ousted them from MHC contention, 48-29, to make their record fall to 1-13. Ayden Swallows led the way in this one with 13 points, Brody Cox had four, Jaylan Burton four, Caiden Miller four, Matt Burton two and Mason Myers two.

Playing at White Creek Elementary on that Monday in a seventh-grade only night, the Lancers were turned back by the hosts, 33-16. Both Gracelyn Adcock and Elliot Smith scored four points to lead their team, Faith Smith had three, Chloe Hancock three, and Kaydra Peters two. These girls stand at 1-2 following the loss.

The varsity Lancer girls hit the road to Waldron on Jan. 24. A cold start to their shooting plagued them in this one and they fell to the Mohawks, 47-23. Kenna Streeval was the leading scorer for the Lancers with eight points while Lillie Goff added six, Gracie Crawhorn five and Jada Sanders four.

Tuesday also had the middle school boys teams in action, playing at Southwestern. The seventh graders dispatched the Spartans with ease, winning 32-21 to move to 7-8 on the season. A host of Lancers were able to score with Carson Siegelin putting in nine points, Max Dodson six, Noah Parkhurst four, Colton Luttrell four, Brinnyn Moss three, Xander Pruitt three, Colton Burton two and Raiden Stanley one.

The evening's night cap saw the eighth graders fall in their final contest of the season, 42-24 to the Spartans. Ayden Swallows was his teams' high scorer with 14, Matt Burton added five, Jaylan Burton two, Caiden Miller two and Carson Siegelin two. They finished their season at 1-14.

Edinburgh's varsity girls were back in action on Thursday as they traveled to North Decatur. They lost to the MHC champs, 62-18, to slip to 6-17 and 0-6 in the conference. Kenna Streeval led the Edinburgh scoring with six points, Jada

Sanders added five, Gracie Crawhorn three, Shyleigh Gobel two and Lillie Goff two.

The fifth- and sixth-grade boys took the short trip to Marietta on Thursday and made it a two-win bus ride. The fifth-grade team spanked the Spartans, 35-7, to improve to 5-2. Kendall Bennett put in 12 points to pace the young Lancers, Mason Turner had eight, Elijah Roberts seven, Amir Petronillo six, Spencer McGaha two and Carson Gentry two. The sixth grade also had a nice night from the field as they downed Southwestern, 38-14. This win bumped their record to 3-4. Charlie Roberts led his team with 21 points, Mason Burton had eight, Blake Andis four, Landon Garris four and Zyan Richardson one.

The only team playing in Edinburgh on Thursday was the eighth-grade girls, who hosted St. Bartholomew. They made the most of it, winning 35-15 to move to 1-2. Mia Denton led her team with 13 points, Chloe Hancock was right behind with 12, Faith Smith five and Kaydra Peters two.

Lancer Arena was the place to be on Friday evening as it was homecoming, the Unified Game took place that night, the 50th anniversary of the 1973 Sectional championship was celebrated, and, oh yeah, there was a couple of basketball games with the Lancer boys playing conference foe Morristown.

The Edinburgh JV won the evening's first game with a 52-33 win over the Yellow Jackets.

The varsity also had no trouble whatsoever handling Morristown, winning big, 71-41. High point man for the night was Caleb Dewey who poured in 24 points to lead all scorers, Jarrett Turner added 16, Connor Ramey also scored 16, Austin Brockman eight and Braylon Bryant seven.

In Saturday's sixth-grade Johnson County Tourney at Franklin, the Lancer team drew Franklin as their opening round opponent. They were not able to keep up with the little Grizzlies and were eliminated, 46-12. Mason Burton and Charlie Roberts each scored four, Kayden Talbott had two and Kendall Bennett two.

Also on Saturday morning, the seventh-grade team played at North Decatur in the semi-final round of the MHC tournament versus North Decatur. They were knocked out of the tourney by a strong Charger squad, 36-15, to end their season at 6-9. Max Dodson led the Edinburgh scoring with eight points, Brinnyn Moss scored five and Colton Luttrell two.

Taking the long trip to Henryville on Saturday evening proved to be advantageous as both the JV and varsity came home with victories. For the JV, they had to fight through the entire game but came out on top, 38-32. Rylan Londeree was the good guys' top scorer with 22 points, Bailey Totten chipped in 12, Caleb Murphy two and Eli Smith two.

In the varsity tilt, this group of Lancers had to fight the whole way as they trailed at the half and were tied with the hosts going into the fourth quarter. Fight they did though, prevailing 63-56. Connor

Ramey led the Lancers with 16 points, Jarrett Turner scored 14, Caleb Dewey 11, Jackson Hartwell seven, Austin Brockman six, Keegan Smith five and Braylon Bryant four.

## Murder defendant asking for bail

A Bartholomew County man accused of the murder of his stepfather is asking the court to set him free on bail.

Damion Bryant, 20, who has lived mostly with his mother in either Clifford or Edinburg his entire life, is accused of committing a Thanksgiving Day shooting that resulted in the death of 49-year-old Wayne E. McGeorge Jr. The alleged killing took place in the McGeorge residence along North Bluff Road, located in the Talberton addition of northwest German Township, according to court documents.

While Indiana law states there is no bail for murder "when the proof is evident or the presumption strong," public defender Chris Monroe, who filed for Thursday's bail review hearing on Jan. 6, insists that it is not the case for his client.

The evidence against Bryant is a probable cause affidavit filed by an investigator with the Bartholomew County Sheriff's Office, Monroe said.

"I don't think it's a murder case," Monroe told Bartholomew Circuit Judge Kelly Benjamin. "I think it's something less than that."

Monroe was asking that bail be set at \$50,000 surety, which would enable Bryant to be released on a 10% cash (\$5,000) bond.

Claiming there are nothing to suggest his client is a threat to others, Monroe told the judge Bryant has never been disciplined at school, has no criminal history, has never been arrested nor even received a traffic ticket.

He also claimed the defendant was the first to call 911 after his stepfather's shooting, which Monroe says is very unusual for a murder suspect to do.

During the hearing, the victim's sister-in-law, Carrie McGeorge, told the judge that Bryant's younger siblings are terrified of him. They are afraid he will either try

to come see them in their house or go next door to their grandparent's residence, she said.

"It would be cruel punishment to good people to let him go free," she said in court.

Chief Deputy Prosecutor Kimberly Sexton-Yeager argued that Bryant has only held one job in his entire life that he quit after only a few days. Other than that, the defendant has always relied on his mother to support him.

And while a friend who lives with his fiancée in a Columbus apartment complex testified in court the defendant can stay with him as long as he wants, that doesn't exclude the possibility that he may be asked to leave in the future, the prosecution argued.

## Man arrested on battery charge

Bartholomew County Sheriff deputies arrested a local man on a charge of domestic battery at the Driftside Mobile Home Park Jan. 23.

At 4:36 p.m., deputies Nathan Holland and Chad Williams responded to the Driftside Mobile Home Park in regards to a reported domestic battery, said Det. Dane Duke, Bartholomew County Sheriff Office spokesman.

Upon arrival, they made contact with a female victim who told them that William Guzman, 41, Edinburg, had become upset at her while having a discussion in the kitchen. The female victim stated that Guzman grabbed a pot of boiling water and swung it in her direction, Duke said. The victim suffered significant visible burns on her forearm and abdominal area.

## New K9s assist in drug busts

Edinburg police executed a narcotics search warrant on a residence in the 900 block of South Holland Street after a four-month investigation.

Police used their two newly formed narcotics K9 teams throughout the investiga-

tion to locate narcotics on traffic stops leaving the South Holland Street residence in Edinburg.

K9 Kiara recovered 11 grams of methamphetamine on one of the traffic stops and K9 Skye who was used on the search warrant helped officers locate about 234 grams of methamphetamine and approximately 6 pounds of marijuana inside the residence.

Edinburg Police Chief Doyne Little arrested Thomas Burton, 62, and Donald Knight, 55, both with addresses listed as 907 S. Holland St., Edinburg, who were transported to the Bartholomew County Jail without incident.

Burton has preliminary charges of dealing in methamphetamine, possession of methamphetamine, possession of marijuana and maintaining a common nuisance, according to jail records. Knight is facing preliminary charges of possession of methamphetamine and maintaining a common nuisance, jail officials said.

The site does not accept electronics, large quantities of cardboard, glass of any kind, plastic bags or items from businesses. Some of these items can be taken to Johnson County Recycling at 900 Arvin Road, Ste. A, Franklin.
